In *Parenting Wisdom – What To Teach The Children* (now Part 2 of KBN7), I express ideas about raising and guiding children which I have used successfully throughout my life. As raising and teaching children is an important function, here's a little background about me. I'm a father, grandfather, and professional martial arts instructor.
